



Kofi Tutu Agyare is a Ghanian Businessman. The Partner/Chief Investment Officer/-Founder at Nubuke Investments LLP.





Lamola is married to Bawinile "Winnie" Msiza.




Birama Boubacar Sidibe is a Malian and the Former VP, Operations at Islamic Development Bank.




Ibrahim Assane Mayaki is a Nigerien politician, who served as the Prime Minister of Niger from November 27, 1997, to January 3, 2000.
